The Admissions Committee considers many factors in making its final admissions selections, including the applicant's grade point average in the pre-pharmacy years; individual grades in Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology; state of residence; the personal interview; letters of recommendation; previous work experience; involvement in extracurricular activities; and the student's passion for pursuing a pharmacy-related career. Your cumulative GPA, along with your Chemistry, Mathematics, and Biology GPA, should be 3.00 (B) or better.
